Welcome back to all our students and a warm welcome to families who have joined the school this term.

This term all students will be asked to continue focussing on learning to a high level of attainment and developing the skills to be responsible citizens.

Manners, consideration of others and high standards of presentation and behaviour will continue to be expected and a continuing focus school wide. All parents know we place a high priority on making our school a happy, safe, secure and supportive environment for all.

As this term is a summer term, there are some changes to our uniform requirements. These are:

- All students must wear a school hat when outside. These are available for \$10.00 from the Resource Room.
- We offer black caps for Year 8 students who are intending to move on to Otumoetai College.
- We also encourage students to wear sunglasses when outside and use sunblock daily.
- Girls change from black tights to black shoes with white ankle socks or brown sandals.
- All students are expected to move from the black track pants to skirts (for girls) or shorts (for boys).
- Most students will move into our mid brown sandals, but the option of plain black shoes and socks remains.

Please note – short black socks are not a uniform item and are unacceptable at school.

Only our bottle green jersey or jackets are uniform items, not sweatshirts, hoodies or other apparel. Students may continue to wear camisoles or V-neck tops under their polo shirts as long as they are hidden from view. Otumoetai College apparel is not acceptable at our school.

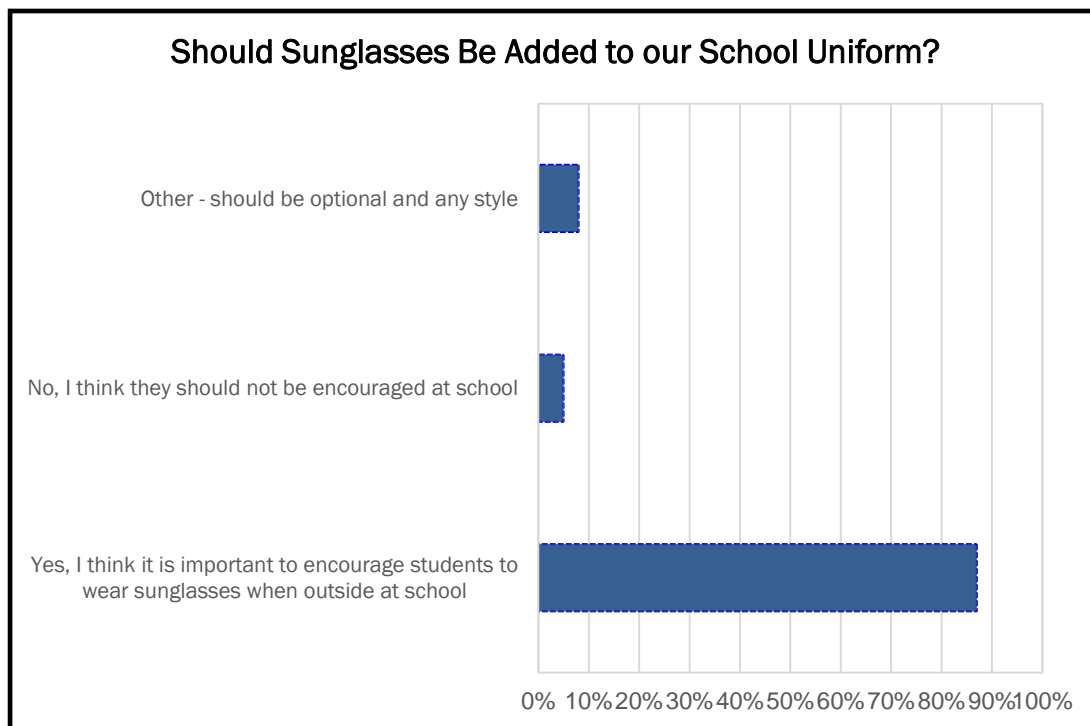
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SUNGLASSES ARE AN OPTIONAL ITEM AT SCHOOL

In 2014 we surveyed parents and caregivers to see what they thought about introducing sunglasses at school. Here are the results of their feedback:



The majority of people who responded supported this move by the school and, as a result, sunglasses are now an optional item for our uniform.

Most parents and caregivers expressed the wish that they be given the choice of style and where glasses are able to be purchased and as a result, we will leave this to parent's discretion.

The expectation is that sunglasses worn at school are in school colours and with a 100% UV rating, eg black, white, red, green or blue.

The school will take care to ensure students are acting in a safe manner while wearing glasses, but it remains the students' responsibility to look after their own glasses and keep them in a safe, secure place just like their sun hats.

Naming Sunglasses at School

We will have engraving tools available in the library before school for students to engrave their name on the sides of their glasses or other personal items.

This service will be provided by the school student leaders.

Why We Believe Sunglasses at School are Important.

As soon as the sun comes out, we all know we should slap on sunscreen and put on a hat to protect ourselves against ultraviolet rays. These can burn the skin, causing premature ageing and cancer. But what many people don't realise is that UV rays can also cause serious and potentially irreversible damage to our eyes. In fact, eyes are ten times more sensitive to UV light than the skin, according to the British Eyecare Trust. It is children who are most at risk, because younger eyes have bigger pupils and clearer lenses, allowing up to 70 per cent more UV light to reach the retina than an adult's eye does.

Worldwide, experts are urging adults and children to wear sunglasses as soon as the sun comes out - winter or summer. Even when it is overcast, UV light penetrates into the eyes and experts advise wearing sunglasses whenever the UV rating is three or higher. Sun damage is linked to serious eye problems such as age related macular degeneration (AMD), the leading cause of irreversible blindness in the industrial world. Sunlight is also linked to other eye conditions including cataracts, pterygia (benign growths on the white of the eye, which can end up blocking vision) and skin cancer of the eyelid. Very bright sunlight - reflected off sand, snow, water or the pavement - can cause immediate damage to the cornea, the eye's surface.

One of the most effective ways to protect our eyes is to wear sunglasses. In some Australian schools, it is mandatory for children to wear sunglasses in the playground.



HOW CAN I BE SUNSMART?

Being SunSmart is about covering up – with clothing, a broad-spectrum sunscreen, a hat and sunglasses. Remember to **SLIP, SLOP, SLAP and WRAP**. To find out more about ready to wear sun protection clothing that fits the bill [click here](#).

SLIP into a long-sleeved shirt and into the shade. Generally, fabrics with a tighter weave and darker colours will give you greater protection from the sun. There are also certain fabrics on the market that have a SPF rating.

SLOP on plenty of broad-spectrum sunscreen of at least SPF30+. Apply sunscreen at least 20 minutes before going outdoors and reapply every two hours. [Read more about using sunscreen](#).

SLAP on a hat with a wide-brim or a cap with flaps – more people are sunburned on their face and neck than any other part of the body.

WRAP on a pair of wrap-around sunglasses – UV radiation is just as dangerous to eyesight as it is for the skin.

2019 YEAR 8 INFORMATION

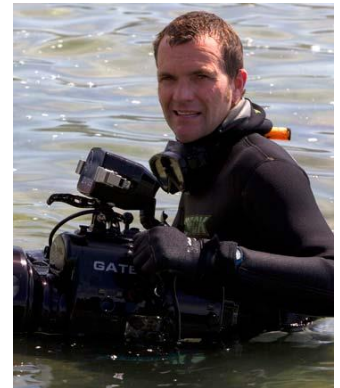
All year 7 students will be given an information pack to bring home this week with details regarding stationery, digital classes and advanced learning classes for 2019.

DISCOVER CHINA !

发现中国 Fā xiàn Zhōng guó !

Discover China! Day is a mini cultural festival for the purpose of promoting students' multicultural awareness, increasing their understanding and appreciation of Chinese culture. In the last two weeks of term 3, Year 7 and Year 8 students were all involved in the cultural events and had fun!

- **Paper-cutting 剪纸 jiǎn zhǐ**

Paper-cutting is a popular folk art in China. They cut pandas, character “春” (spring) and some “window blossom”.

The folding and drawing for some patterns were actually challenging to do but they certainly nailed it!



- **Designing and trying on traditional costume 体验传统服饰 tǐ yàn chuán tǒng fú shì**

China's thousands of years of history has left us a splendid costume culture. Tang suits, cheongsams (Qipao) and Hanfu are still popular nowadays.

Students tried on the costumes and designed their own patterns for Qipao and Hanfu.



- **Making dumplings 包饺子 bāo jiǎo zi**

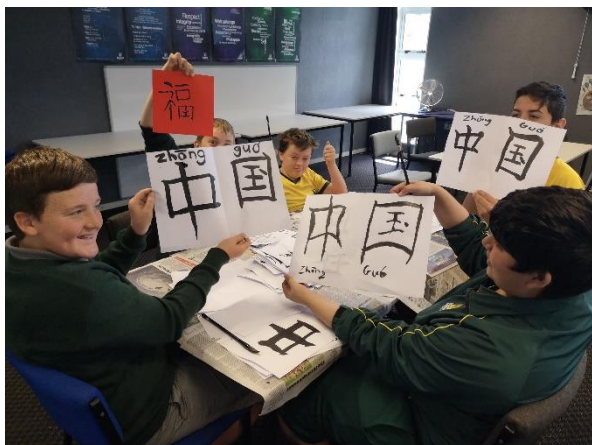
In this workshop, students learned how to make and fry dumplings!



- **Calligraphy 书法 shū fǎ**

Chinese calligraphy is an art of writing Chinese characters. Four Treasures of the Study (brush, paper, inkstick, ink stone) are needed. Students started from using a brush, to writing basic strokes.

In the end, they were all able to write characters, such as 福 fú (good luck) and 中国 zhōng guó (China).



At the end of the day, students presented their calligraphy and paper-cutting works and performed a costume walk-show in the hall. Mandarin extension class students also performed martial arts 五步拳 wǔ bù quán on the stage.

PICKING UP AND DROPPING OFF STUDENTS

Parents and Caregivers become part of the solution

Please pre-plan your pick up and drop off of students at the car park Carlton St reserve off Ngatai Road, avoid Charles Street altogether and let your student walk up to the school. The Carlton St reserve, off Ngatai Road below the school, provides plenty of free vehicle parks and students can walk safely to and from school.

The congestion in Charles Street becomes unsafe and it is important for buses to use this area. It would also leave this small street accessible for parents picking up a student in emergencies.

Please consider a healthier safer alternative of parking and walking.

Safety Concerns in School Carpark

Some mornings before school there are sports training sessions. Consequently, there are often students around our school earlier than normal. All too often we are seeing parents who are clearly in a hurry to drop their child off and get to their own work, who drive into the front carpark at really excessive speeds. They usually then continue with the speed and exit by the recycling and clothes bins towards the college.

Others drive into the exits at similar speeds. Numerous times, other drivers have had to stop their car, or get out of the way on foot as this happens.

Our main concern is for those students on foot who are also early for a training session. We would like to appeal to our parents dropping off a student to put student safety first when entering or exiting our car park.

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
