The school Board of Trustees met on Thursday 25th October 2018, outlined below are some highlights from that meeting:

- We are impressed with the innovative teaching practices staff at OIS are encouraged to use. Professional development initiatives in the subject areas of maths and writing are being well utilised to enhance learning programmes across the school. Furthermore, our contributing schools are also benefiting from these opportunities, through their involvement in our 'Kāhui Ako / Community of Learning'.
- Teachers have been learning how to use a new assessment tool designed by the Ministry Of Education called PACT. We intend to host a parent information evening toward the end of the term which will outline the implementation of, and the types of information gleaned from these assessments.
- We are proud to announce that due to the cancellation of the Tauranga Moana Cultural Festival "Ra Whakangahau", an Otumoetai Cluster Schools kapahaka festival will be held instead. The name for this local festival is "Te Rā Rēhia" and will be hosted by our school on Friday 23rd November. The spirit of "Te Rā Rēhia" is to provide all children with the opportunity to participate in a quality Kapa Haka festival. In doing so we create memories for these children and grow them as people. More information will be shared as plans are finalised.
- End of year activities are being planned and budgeted for. PaCT INFORMATION

The Progress and Consistency Tool (PaCT) – Using It in Our School

For the past two years our teachers have been developing their understanding and expertise in using this tool in writing. 2018 has seen teachers developing the use of PaCT in reading and we will include mathematics in 2019. During this time, our teachers have learned that the New Zealand Curriculum in writing is much broader than what schools have been teaching in the past. For example, students being able to write across all subject areas and disciplines with purpose.

What is the PaCT?

The PaCT has been designed to help teachers make dependable judgements on students' progress and achievement. The PaCT is more than an online tool:

- It supports the New Zealand Curriculum. It prompts teachers to notice what students know and can do across the breadth of mathematics, reading and writing. It helps teachers to understand the learning progressions set by the Curriculum.
- It supports moderation. It moderates individual teacher expectations through the frameworks and illustrations. It provides a common framework for teachers to discuss their judgement decisions with one another.
- It also supports assessment for learning. The breakdown of mathematics, reading and writing into aspects gives greater clarity about what to notice when making observations of students, in learning conversations and through set tasks.

More about the Tool and How It Can Assist Teachers Make Accurate Judgements About Student Progress

The Frameworks

The learning progression frameworks are a principal feature of the PaCT. They break down mathematics, reading and writing into different aspects and illustrate the stages of learning in each aspect. They give teachers a clearer picture of these areas of the New Zealand Curriculum and the National Standards. They prompt teachers to consider what students know and can do across the breadth of these areas.

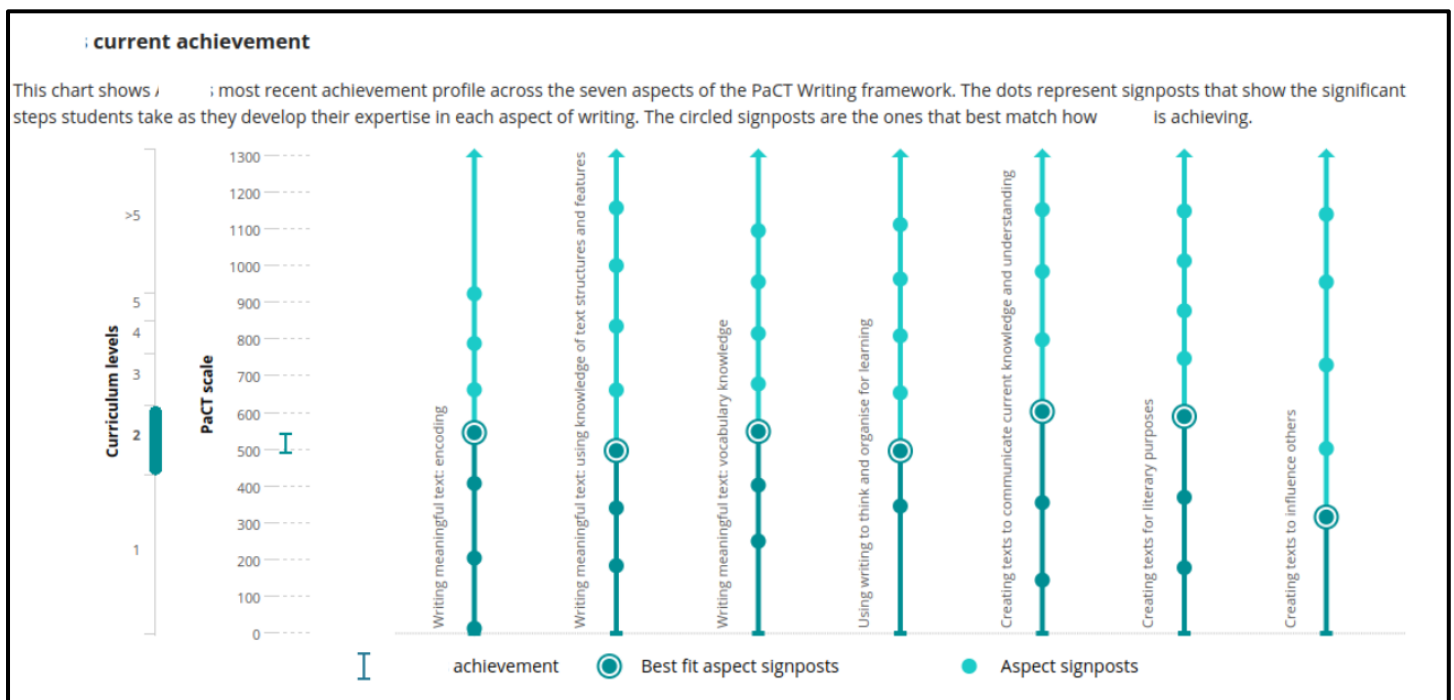
The frameworks were developed by curriculum experts, using the New Zealand Curriculum, the Literacy Learning Progressions and the Numeracy Project. About 1,000 teaching professionals helped to develop and trial the sets of illustrations linked to each aspect.

The Aspects

There are seven to eight aspects in each learning area (mathematics, reading and writing). For example, mathematics aspects are: additive thinking; multiplicative thinking; patterns and relationships; using symbols and expressions to think mathematically; geometric thinking; measurement sense, statistical investigations; interpreting statistical and chance situations.

The PaCT breaks each aspect into observable and distinct learning stages. The illustration below shows a PaCT writing framework with the stages of learning shown as 'bubbles' on each aspect line. It acknowledges that learning is not linear and there can be wider 'gaps' between one stage and another. This illustration shows the progress of an individual student in writing. On the left it shows the curriculum levels the student is currently working at and their achievement on the PaCT scale. The scale is used by the teacher to determine how close the student is to moving up to the next step in the aspects.

The bigger circles show where the student is achieving in each of the seven aspects of writing. These could vary from aspect to aspect, showing a student's strengths and weaknesses.



How Will the PaCT Help Teachers and Schools?

- Teachers make judgements on student progress and achievement, moment by moment, day by day. The PaCT will give teachers confidence that their interim and end of year judgements against New Zealand Curriculum levels are consistent and dependable.
- The PaCT online tool helps overcome the difficulties in making overall judgements for students who achieve highly in some aspects of mathematics, reading or writing but not so highly in others.
- Because teachers will be basing their judgements on the same sets of frameworks and illustrations they, and their colleagues, will have more confidence that their judgements are consistent and dependable.
- The frameworks give teachers a common tool for moderation discussions with other schools.
- The PaCT also helps teachers give specific and constructive feedback to students and parents. For example, a teacher may say that a student is progressing well in addition and multiplication but needs more support with geometry.

The Benefits of PaCT Over Time

- Teachers will be able to track students' and class progress; use the data to inform teaching programmes; and use it to guide decisions about how to improve students' learning.
- School leaders will have dependable information on progress in their school and areas where extra support might be needed.
- Boards of Trustees will be better able to track progress towards their school's goals and targets and plan for the school's future.

Your child's end of year report has been formatted to enable their teacher to give you precise progress and achievement information based on the writing PaCT.

ŌTŪMOETAI COMMUNITY OF LEARNING / KĀHUI AKO UPDATE

This year the Otumoetai Community of Learning (COL/ Kāhui Ako) worked with the ERO Team in Wellington to develop a Hauora/Wellbeing Survey specifically for our students. The majority of the Year 4-13 students in the Otumoetai Cluster of schools undertook the Hauora/Wellbeing Survey in Term Two. General survey trends were shared with all schools in Term Three. Individual schools retained ownership of student's voice particular to their school. From these results, we will be working on a plan in 2019 to implement the goals/next steps identified from this survey. The survey results suggest that our focus should include:

- working to further engage with our whānau and families,
- building better student/teacher relationships and
- developing student agency (student agency refers to learning through activities that are meaningful and relevant to learners, driven by their interests, and often self-initiated with appropriate guidance from teachers. To put it simply, student agency gives students understanding, voice and choice in how they learn).

We look forward to keeping our communities updated as our journey progresses.

STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

As you all know the school acknowledges students' successes by awarding colours at assembly to recognise students' achievement. The following is the criteria we have published on our school website:

- The first level standards are green merit ribbons awarded to any student who achieves a number of criteria in mathematics, reading or writing. These are shown in each student's portfolio and based on our minimum standards for pupil achievement.
- The second level colours are blue merit ribbons awarded to students for significant contributions in academic, cultural, sporting or citizenship categories. All students who represent the school in interschool activities will receive one of these awards.
- The third and most prestigious award is a red Principal's Award. This award will be given at the end of the year to our most outstanding students. These students will have made significant contributions to the school across all four categories. Students can be nominated for awards by their teacher, coach and fellow students.

There is also a variety of additional awards used to acknowledge service to the school such as library, etc. Home learning is also acknowledged for students who complete all tasks each term. There is no limit to the number of awards each student can aspire to and students are encouraged to sew their merit awards onto their school jacket or jersey sleeve.

This year we have also recognised individual student achievement outside of the school. This will be limited to students who are successful as representatives in regional and national competitions. General participation in other activities will not earn a sporting or cultural colour but will be acknowledged in our school newsletter.

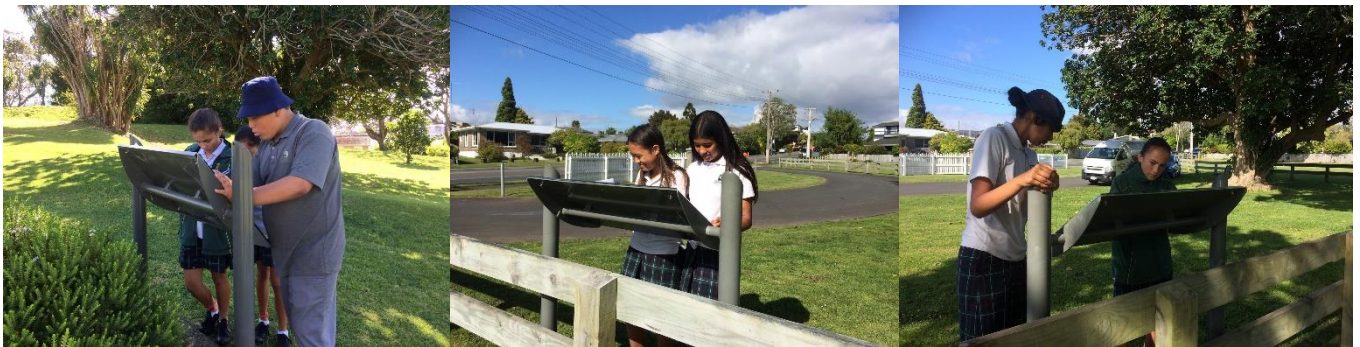
OUR TRIP TO OTUMOETAI PA - TE ARA POUTAMA

On Friday 26th October 2018 the Otumoetai Intermediate Te Ara Poutama group travelled to the Otumoetai Pa located in Matua.

We were given a booklet of questions that we had to find answers to. The answers were located on boards around the Pa. We were put in groups of two and had to carefully read the boards around to find our answers.

Some of the interesting facts we found out were:

- Otumoetai Pa was confiscated from Ngai te Rangi by the government because of the wars in 1864.
- The people who lived at Otumoetai Pa were forced to leave their ancestral homes.
- There were around 2,000 people living there at that time, who were of Ngai te Rangi decent.

WBEET BAYMATHS 2018

Now in its ninth year, the annual BAYMATHS competition for Years 6, 7 and 8 students was recently held in the Otumoetai Intermediate School Hall, over two nights. On October 18th, Year 7 and 8 students from afar-a-field as Hastings, Gisborne, Hamilton, Rotorua and of course teams from the Bay of Plenty put their heads together in an effort to win the mathematics problem-solving competition. Thirty-three Year 7 teams and thirty-eight Year 8 teams (each team comprising three members) competed for medals, prizes and of course the trophy for the top team in each year group.



Major Year 7 placings for the top team overall went to Tauranga Intermediate (first), with Mount Maunganui Intermediate second and Peachgrove Intermediate in third placing. Otumoetai's A team (Brea Miller, Conor Foreman and Alex Rawlinson) and our B team (Will Kirkwood, Tomas Andrew and Harrison Dent) also achieved commendable placings – 15th and 17th respectively.



In the Year 8 competition, the top teams were Tauranga Intermediate (first), Ilminster Intermediate second and Mount Maunganui Intermediate coming third. Our A team (Tejeshwar Sandhu, Reuben Timms and Malachi Flintoff) came out 17th overall and our B team (Ashlyn Judkins, Michelle Clarke and Robert Unsworth) achieved 19th placing – very commendable results!

The Year 6 competition was held on the evening of 24 October and saw 51 teams from around the Bay playing off. This year Lynmore School, from Rotorua walked away with the Year 6 Top Team Trophy for 2018, with Tauriko School second and Matua Primary in third place.



We thank all our Otumoetai Intermediate students, parents and staff who assisted on each evening as markers, runners and in various other capacities. Without that help and support the competition would not have been the success it was.

PICKING UP AND DROPPING OFF STUDENTS

Parents and Caregivers become part of the solution

Please pre-plan your pick up and drop off of students at the car park Carlton St reserve off Ngatai Road, avoid Charles Street altogether and let your student walk up to the school. The Carlton St reserve, off Ngatai Road below the school, provides plenty of free vehicle parks and students can walk safely to and from school.

The congestion in Charles Street becomes unsafe and it is important for buses to use this area. It would also leave this small street accessible for parents picking up a student in emergencies.

Please consider a healthier safer alternative of parking and walking.

Safety Concerns in School Carpark

Some mornings before school there are sports training sessions. Consequently, there are often students around our school earlier than normal. All too often we are seeing parents who are clearly in a hurry to drop their child off and get to their own work, who drive into the front carpark at really excessive speeds. They usually then continue with the speed and exit by the recycling and clothes bins towards the college.

Others drive into the exits at similar speeds. Numerous times, other drivers have had to stop their car, or get out of the way on foot as this happens.

Our main concern is for those students on foot who are also early for a training session. We would like to appeal to our parents dropping off a student to put student safety first when entering or exiting our car park.
