You may be aware of the nationwide crisis in recruiting and retaining teachers. While there are many more children coming into the school system, there are not enough new teachers being trained. Urgent and significant changes are needed to ensure that the teaching profession can attract the people it needs and to ensure class sizes do not start to increase.

Next **Wednesday, 20th June, 2018** the teachers from this school will be attending a NZEI Te Riu Roa paid union meeting regarding the *Kua Tae Te Wā* - It's Time campaign. The campaign aims to free teachers to teach and principals to lead, by getting the additional support and staff that schools need. The meetings will allow our teachers to discuss how the Ministry of Education has responded to changes that the union is seeking.

Most of our teaching staff are members of NZEI and legally entitled to attend this meeting. The teachers will be leaving school on **Wednesday 20th June, 2018** to attend their paid union meeting which starts at **1.30 pm** in the TECT Arena. Teachers from across the region will be attending this Paid Union Meeting.

I strongly encourage parents to make arrangements for the supervision of their child from **12.30 pm** during that afternoon. If you are unable to arrange supervision at home, please advise your child's teacher so that your child can be supervised for the afternoon at school.

I appreciate that this creates some inconvenience for families. However, I encourage you to support your teachers as they strive to achieve the changes which will safeguard quality education for all children and ensure we make teaching an attractive profession for graduates. Anyone who may need help with arrangements should contact the office.

The school Board of Trustees met on Thursday 24th May, outlined below are some highlights from that meeting:

- The Board are delighted with the effort and energy put in by staff to ensure students have 'hit the ground running' for this busy school term. Positive interactions is at the heart of a healthy school culture, and we are grateful to staff for the friendly, professional relationships they have fostered with our children.
- Testing for reporting on student progress and goal setting is well underway in classes. Three-way conferences are scheduled for early July, and written reports will be sent home shortly thereafter. It is vital that our children can articulate what their 'next learning steps' are in relation to their progress to-date. We encourage you to attend these meetings and work alongside staff to help your child to reach their potential.
- We are very pleased with the level of professional development being pushed out across our Otumoetai Community of Learning cluster schools. There have been several excellent oral and written language workshops held which teachers from our contributing schools have benefitted from. Certainly, by having Primary school students from across cluster schools taught lessons which cover similar concepts, this makes planning at the Intermediate level more cohesive. We anticipate that this will lead to accelerated progress for all students in the long-term.
- We appreciate the \$45,000.00 grant received by TECT which will go towards replacing the existing Astroturf. We hope that work on this will start over the July school holidays.
- The renovation work on Block B is currently in full swing, and we thank everyone for their patience as these classrooms are modified. Students will no doubt enjoy working in a modernised workspace - and we're sure many staff will want to claim 'dibs' also!
- We hope to see many of you at the informal café style parent and community focus group meeting on Wednesday 20th June, 2018 from 7.00 pm. You will be asked to give feedback on the school's perceived strengths, weaknesses, opportunities we should pursue and areas of concern. All Board members will attend, and we are keen to meet as many of you as we can.

THE 2018 ANCHOR AIMS GAMES ARE GOING TO BE MASSIVE

AIMS Games entries smash all records. This elite sporting competition for Years 7 and 8 students over 21 sports is the biggest yet. This year the tournament has grown to 386 participating schools with over 10,138 intermediate-aged athletes coming to Tauranga from all over New Zealand.

The 2018 AIMS Games will run from Sunday 9th to Friday 14th September 2018 at a range of venues across the Western Bay of Plenty.

Our school is one of the four founding and hosting schools with students participating in most of the sports offered. Last week we entered 30+ teams which involves 350 students for the 2018 Anchor AIMS Games. Payments have been loaded to your school account and statements sent home. Payments can be made in instalments as long as it is paid in full two weeks after receiving your notice.

Our school has a proud tradition of success at these games and has consistently been placed in the top ten in the number of medals won. This premier sporting event for 11, 12 and 13 year olds is a strategic partnership between Sport Bay of Plenty, Tauranga City Council and the four Bay of Plenty intermediate schools.

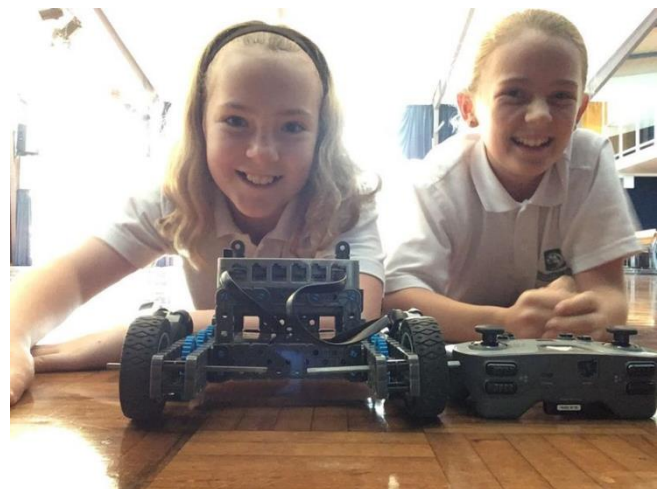
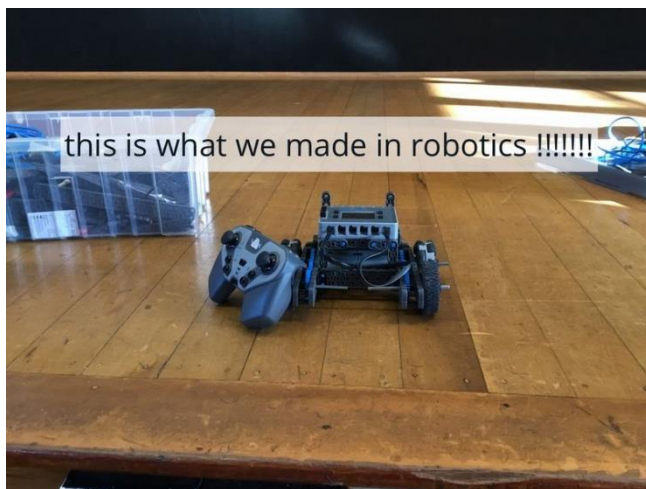
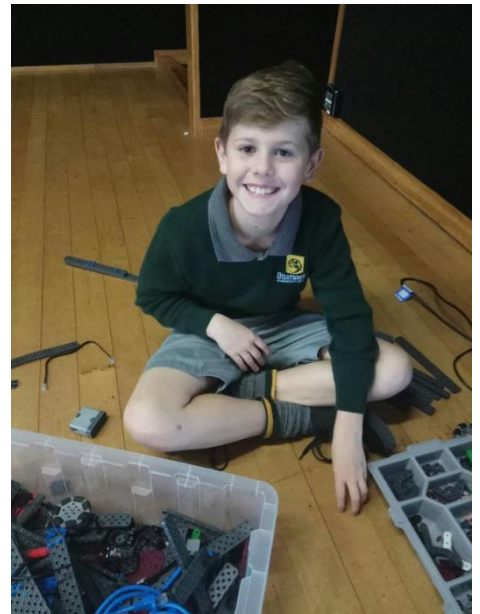
OTUMOETAI INTERMEDIATE LOVES READING!

LES ELDER AND THE 'NANCY WAKE' WORLD CUP

At Monday's assembly we had two very special guests attend. A huge thank you to Rachel Wikeepa, as she organised not only for Les Elder to come into school this morning, but also for the Nancy Wake Rugby World Cup, that the NZ Black Ferns won last year, to attend as well.

Les Elder was a member of the Black Ferns successful 2017 campaign, winning the World cup in Ireland. The team made history by becoming the first ever women's team to be named the World Rugby Team of the Year. In addition to the success of the team, Les has recently made history by becoming one of the first contracted Black Fern players in May 2018. She is one of 30 of this country's best female 15 a-side rugby players - a historic agreement between the players' association and New Zealand Rugby (NZR). Les has been also been a contracted NZ rugby 7s player in 2016 and works for BOPRU to develop the game at grass root level.



Les addressed the school and then met with boys and girls who are interested in or play rugby. They had a very in depth question and answer session and then the students were given the opportunity to have their photos taken with Les and the Rugby World Cup.

Les explained how the cup became affectionately known as 'Nancy'. Named after Nancy Wake, born in Wellington, NZ - she was a secret agent during the Second World War. Living in Marseilles with her French industrialist husband she became a saboteur and Resistance fighter. She was the Allies' most decorated servicewoman of WWII, and the Gestapo's most-wanted person.

Many thanks to Les for coming in to share her valuable time with us and share the wonderful trophy she helped win - what a great way to start our week!

SCIENCE SCHOLARS 2018

Twenty one Year 7 'Science Scholars' have started working towards their Entomology badge and certificate in block three on Friday afternoons. The students are working on a mixture of tasks set out by the Science Award Trust and some extra things that we will be covering in class.

Some of the tasks the students are completing after researching are: making labelled models, taking photos of insects and naming them, making posters, mobiles, multimedia presentations, reports and newspaper articles. Kyle Koch made a great recipe page on insects as food. He had a Mexican salsa recipe with ants soaked in butter, chocolate infused ground meal worms and Brazilian Winged Queen ants that taste like mint dipped in chocolate sauce.

The Science Scholars are really enjoying their time together at the end of the week and pardon the pun but the room is just 'buzzing'. They have joint projects on the go and are enjoying sharing their new found knowledge with the class.



Check out some of the tasks that the students have researched, worked on and presented in class. The group are putting in many hours of work, sharing their findings with their families at home and working cooperatively together in class.

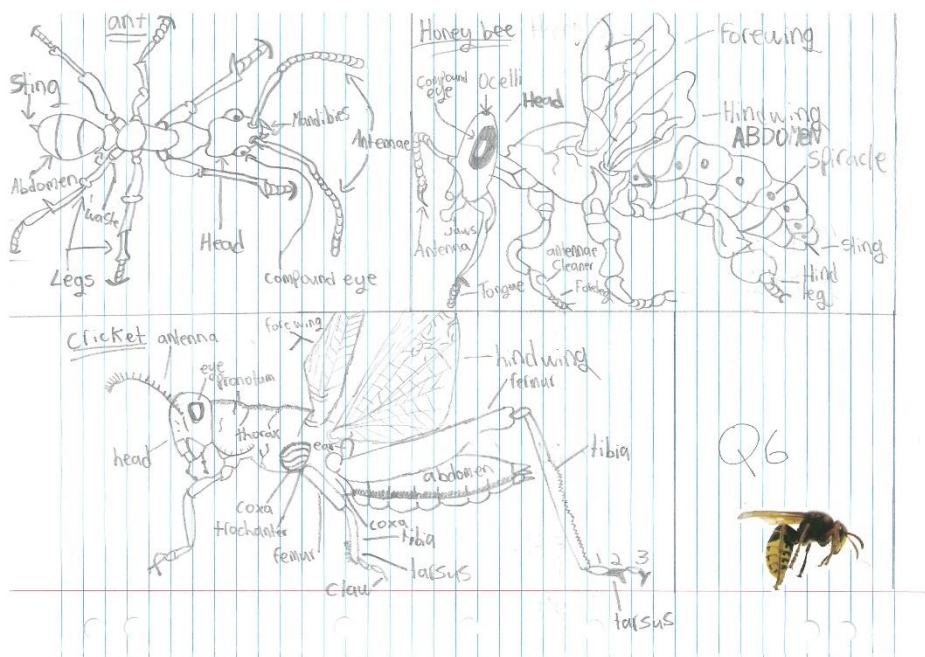
Celise Blears-Woodcock - with her bug trap and keeper: The flap snaps shut and then you can wrap the string around a hook at the back to secure it. The trap has a viewing window and air vents. Celise has caught a lizard, praying mantis and spider so far.

Charlie Hockings and Kylan Ward prepared and presented an amazing slideshow full of information on 10 flying insects and the Maori names for them. They did a lot of research and pronounced the Maori names extremely well.

Charlie's bug catcher has a flap that you put bait on. When the bug lands on the flap you can pull the string and the flap shuts off its escape route. The bottle has been converted so the insect is funnelled into a holding space.

PICKING UP AND DROPPING OFF STUDENTS

Parents and Caregivers become part of the solution

Please pre-plan your pick up and drop off of students at the car park Carlton St reserve off Ngatai Road avoid Charles Street altogether and let your student walk up to the school. The Carlton St reserve off Ngatai Road below the school provides plenty of free vehicle parks and students can walk safely to and from school.

The congestion in Charles Street becomes unsafe and it is important for buses to use this area. It would also leave this small street accessible for parents picking up a student in emergencies.

Please consider a healthier safer alternative of parking and walking.

Safety Concerns in School Carpark

Some mornings before school there are sports training sessions. Consequently, there are often students around our school earlier than normal. All too often we are seeing parents who are clearly in a hurry to drop their child off and get to their own work, who drive into the front carpark at really excessive speeds. They usually then continue with the speed and exit by the recycling and clothes bins towards the college.

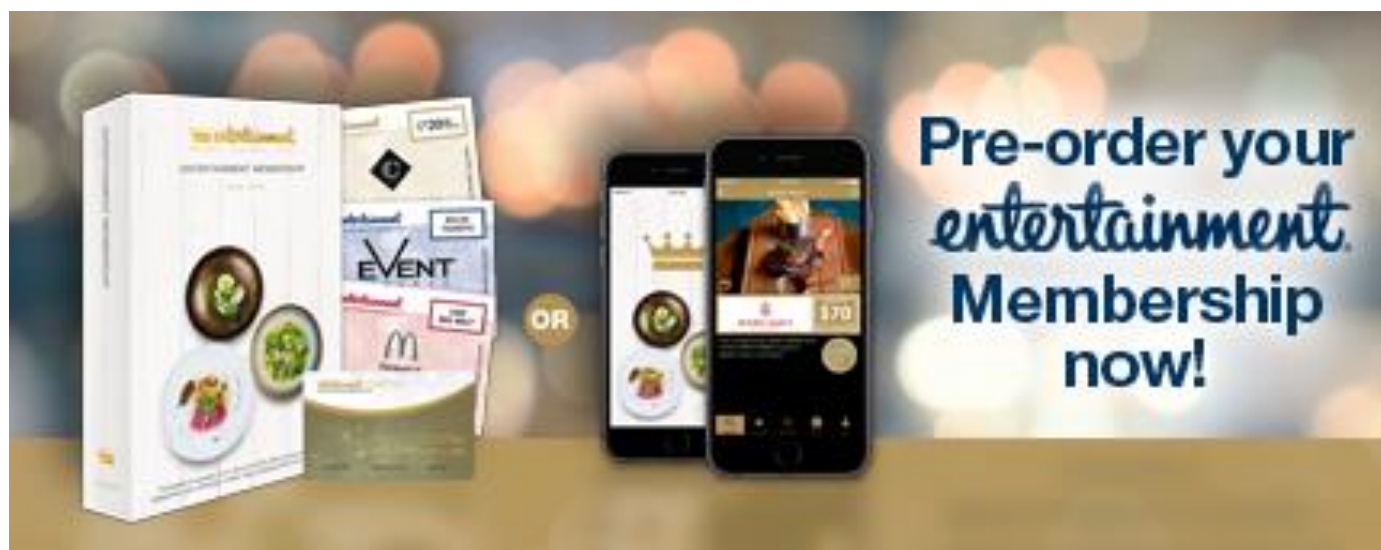
Others drive into the exits at similar speeds. Numerous times, other drivers have had to stop their car, or get out of the way on foot as this happens.
